## **Pampering Parents**

Parents caring for a child in treatment have little time for beauty and wellbeing such routines are often considered unaffordable luxuries. Just the tiniest of pampering can make the world of difference, which is why Cure Our Kids has introduced two new initiatives:

- **Pamper Days**

Wonderful volunteer Sarah is a qualified massage therapist and has been treating parents to Swedish massages, while fellow volunteer Yael has offered manicures and hand-massages. Parents relish the experience and can be seen floating through the ward afterward!

- **Hairdresser Day**

# It's OK, others feel the same way

In late May, Cure Our Kids hosted two **Parent Gathering** dinners that brought together over 170 parents who have experienced the journey of a childhood cancer. As per usual, the room was instantly abuzz with parents, most of whom had never met before, sharing experiences, exchanging tips and forming support networks.

After dinner, we invited **Dr Pam McGrath**, a Senior Research Fellow and distinguished author from the Central Queensland University to share her insights on Post-traumatic Stress and Childhood Cancer.

Pam provided information on the symptoms, pro-active strategies for reducing or preventing the impact of such stress and strategies for coping. Most importantly, she normalised the experience of post-traumatic stress symptoms.

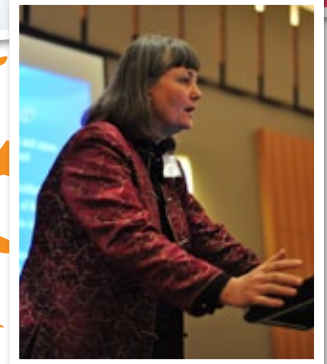

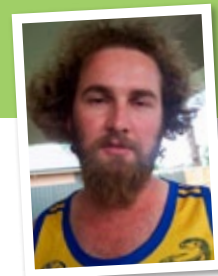
## International Childhood Cancer Day

### 50k's 4 Kids

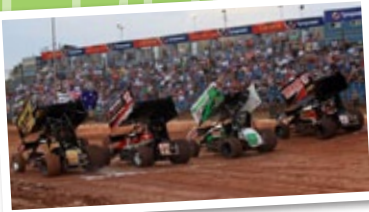

## The Centre for children with Cancer at Westmead Update

Three years ago, Carolyn Dodds and the Cure Our Kids Board took on the ambitious undertaking to develop and construct a new Centre for Children with Cancer in NSW – a purpose-built facility that incorporates the very latest in medical treatments, delivers holistic care, provides family amenities and has provision for clinical trials and medical research in a unique and life-affirming way.

It's been a long (frustrating) haul laying the groundwork, but we're happy to report that we have made significant headway. Our building has been approved by NSW Health as an integral part of The Children's Hospital at Westmead's Masterplan and has captured the attention of politicians, bureaucrats and individuals far and wide.

In January this year, we submitted an application to the Federal Governments Health and Hospitals Regional Cancer Centres Initiative for \$56.8M – unfortunately we were unsuccessful. We are now rewriting this submission as a Business Case, which we will submit to Treasury to start the ball rolling with NSW Health's approval process. This Business case will also form the basis of our future application for funding from the Federal and State Governments and our fundraising efforts in the community.

As complex as that all sounds, it's quite an achievement and we couldn't have done it without the commitment and assistance of some very talented professionals from **Johnstaff Projects, S2F Architects, Davis Langdon and Aurora Projects**, all totally pro bono!

We're now ready to start building a team to help us with the next stage of this project – raising \$56.8M. 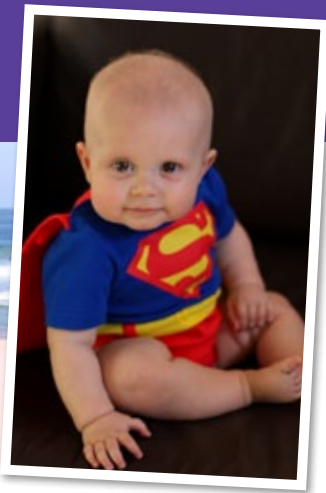
## The Cisco Kids Team
